

### CRITICAL CONCERT INFORMATION

(—a reprint of Mr. Johnston's e-mail to parents)

Concert season is here, and I am writing to provide some information to assist families in their planning.

First, I want to stress how important it is to the academy that every child participate in his or her concert. Excellence in choral music is one of the distinctive marks of the academy program, and every student in the school takes a full credit course in choral music every year. The choirs have been working hard for many weeks on their music for these performances, and every chorister is entitled to the satisfaction that he or she will receive from an artistically successful performance. The dates and times of the concerts were published long before the school year began, and I hope that they are circled in red on everyone's refrigerator door. If not, please double check now.

The concert for Grades 3-12 will be on the evening of Monday, December 14, from 7:00 pm until approximately 8:50 pm. Choristers need to be at the school, in uniform, by 6:30 pm, and need to plan to stay until the performance is over.

The concert for Grades PK and K will be on the afternoon of Thursday, December 17, from 2:00 pm until approximately 3:15 pm. Choristers need to be at the school, in uniform, by 1:30 pm, and need to plan to stay until the performance is over. At the parents' option, these students may be picked up at noon dismissal and returned in time for the concert, or they may be placed in after school care after dismissal and before the concert.

The concert for Grades 1 and 2 will be on the afternoon of Friday, December 18, from 2:00 pm until approximately 3:15 pm. Choristers need to be at the school, in uniform, by 1:30 pm, and need to plan to stay until the performance is over. At the parents' option, these students may be picked up at noon dismissal and returned in time for the concert, or they may be left in after school care after dismissal and before the concert.

Concert etiquette is important, and we want to maintain quiet during the performance. To assist with this, The PTC has arranged for babysitting during all three of the concert events. Babysitting will be held in the Pre-K rooms for all three events. The babysitting rooms will open 20 minutes before each event. Babysitters will be from the Girl Scout Troop, so please be prepared to give an appropriate donation for their services. If you plan to use the babysitting services, please RSVP to Mary Ellen Madalinski at maryellenscout@yahoo.com.

When the concert ends, parents are reunited with their children. To reduce confusion, here is how we will do it:

The grades 3-12 concert will end with all grades on stage. Middle and upper scholars will be dismissed from the stage and expected to go to their parents. Students in grades 3, 4 and 5 will be taken back to the classroom as classes. Please do not try to intercept these classes. Parents are asked to go to the classroom to claim their children. If this seems to be an unnecessary burden, please understand that it is done this way because we do not want to lose track of a single child.

After the PK-K and first-second concerts, the faculty will hold the students at the stage, and parents may come to the stage and claim their children, in an orderly way, with the teachers' knowledge. It may take a few extra minutes to make sure that the teachers are aware of which children are being reunited with their parents, but the extra few minutes are very good value if they enhance safety. Thanks for your patience with the process.

The music program is one of the best things we do at The Atonement Academy, and it is an important reason many of our families have chosen the school. I have been attending academy concerts since November 2003, initially as a prospective school parent, later as a school parent, later as a school administrator, and they have given me great joy. If this is your first semester in our school, then you are in for a very special experience. If yours is a returning family, then you know from past years how important these events are.

We have a very talented and very dedicated music faculty. Thank you for your support of their work and that of your children.

### MIDDLE SCHOOL SPEECH TOURNAMENT IN JANUARY

Those 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students interested in competing in a speech tournament in January need to contact Mrs. Surovic as soon as possible. The deadline for entering is January 10, 2010, with the meet being held at St. Matthew's Catholic School on Saturday, January 30, 2010 from 8:30 until 1:15, depending upon the events in which the student participates. The events include Poetry Interpretation (must be memorized), Prose (read from manuscript), Reading from Speeches and Due Interpretation (think duet acting, must be memorized). A student may enter 2 of the 3 categories.

Time limits are 5 minutes for each event. Please look for your selection over the holidays so we can begin practicing when we return. This experience should give the speech students a great preparation for our PSIA meet in March. If there are any questions, please contact Mrs. Surovic at <u>gsurovic@aol.com</u>.

PSIA testing will occur when the students return from the holiday break, including Mathematics, Science, Listening Skills and Vocabulary. After the tests are graded, notices will appear in the Crusader Times of those eligible for the team. Please keep reading!!!
